Want a daytime book group? This group is for people 50 years of age and older, meeting the third Thursday each month from 10:30 – 11:30 am.

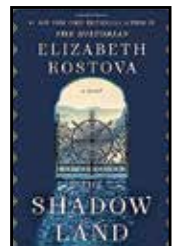

The Detroit Historical Society shares the history of the World Series win by the Detroit Tigers 50 years ago.

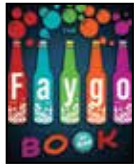

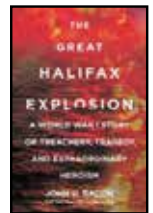
