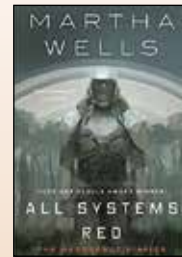

## Senior Book Group at Dublin Community Senior Center

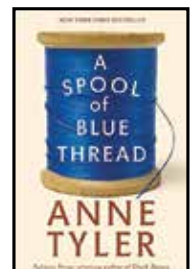
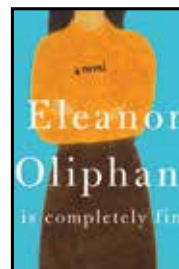
